Amanda presented her annual report at February's board meeting. 2022 highlights included:

- Amanda gave a big thank-you to Captain Beth. Beth was instrumental in the successful turnover of the position to Amanda.
- Both ferries passed their Coast Guard inspections with flying colors. The crew did a great job preparing for the inspections, completing more safety drills than required and ensuring that the Independence and Islander were in prime condition.



- The crew participated in fire extinguisher and emergency flare training with the Chebeague Fire and Rescue. (*Thanks to Chief Munroe for facilitating this training!*)
- All crew members were once again certified in CPR/First Aid/AED training. (*Thanks to Beth for conducting these important trainings here on Chebeague!*)

CTC's safety goals for 2023:

- Reconfigure some of the Independence man-overboard equipment to improve efficiency.
- Continue to evaluate and update safety training procedures for new captains and deckhands using feedback from those who have participated in the program.
- Explore options for a health and wellness program for the crew.
- Work with the Town and event venues to ensure public safety on the boat and wharves during large events.
